

Our welcoming and inclusive school community is a place where everyone can belong. We are committed to providing a caring and nurturing environment where you are well supported through your learning journey, developing personal qualities and the confidence to excel in your chosen pathway in life.

Personal excellence and care for others

We celebrate diversity. It is our strength and a source of pride. It means that we respect, understand and celebrate the things that make each of us unique. By nurturing wellbeing and relationships, we create real connections with each other – by leaning into these we are supported to achieve personal excellence.

Divisional structure

With more than two thousand six hundred students, Burnside High School is one of the largest schools in New Zealand, yet as a student you will be known and supported as an individual.

Our school is divided into four divisions. Teachers and other staff across these divisions get to know each of the

approximately 600 students in their division quickly on their arrival in Year 9. Students remain in the same division for four years, allowing the relationship between the divisional staff members and students in each division to grow stronger each year.

The benefits of our divisional structure are two-fold – you are able to reap all of the advantages and opportunities of a large school, while enjoying the sense of identity and security within a smaller peer group.

Student Support

Attention to the health and well-being of all students is of significant importance to ensure everyone is able to participate and engage in school activities to the best of their ability. This support and guidance builds a sense of belonging.

Your Support Network:

- Your divisional team follows your year group throughout your time at Burnside High School
- Our Counselling Team comprises five full-time Counsellors with Masters Degree qualifications in counselling, assisted and supported by Counselling Interns on placement working towards a Master of Counselling degree.
- Te Whare Akoranga, the Burnside High School's Learning Support Department is a student-focused learning hub, welcoming students who find learning challenging. This is where a number of programmes and supports are delivered. Our team consists of highly qualified and experienced teaching and support staff from a diverse range of backgrounds.




Celebrate our bicultural heritage

Te Reo classes and kapahaka are available to all students at all levels. We are proud participants of regional kapahaka competitions as well as the Manu Kōrero competition.

Curriculum


Students have a wide range of options available to them at each level, largely due to our size. This begins with a broad range of core and option classes in Year 9, and leads towards a recommended five option classes in Year 13. Each of the eight curriculum areas are represented by high level courses and expert teachers who are specialists in their teaching area.

Learning Support

Individual learning support is provided for students with specific learning needs. The Learning Center is able to provide specialist reading tuition, assistance with correspondence courses, tutoring in a range of subjects, catch-up opportunities for students who have been off school for a period of time, provision for special assessment conditions and a myriad of other opportunities.


English for Speakers of Other Languages

Academic Achievement

At Burnside, our school values encourage students to have pride in their work and strive to excel in all areas of their learning. We see this commitment reflected each year in our NCEA results which are always far above National averages, and over half of our Year 13 students passing Level 3 with an Excellence or Merit Endorsement. We are also regularly in the top ranked schools in the city in our Scholarship results, with 51 in 2023, of which 8 were at Outstanding level.



Unleash your creativity

The Creative Arts are more than just extracurricular activities – they’re an integral part of our curriculum, fostering innovation, critical thinking, and collaboration.

Creativity is an important part of the Creative Arts programme at Burnside High School. The opportunities are vast and varied from designing to performing, devising, choreographing, and composing. Through timetable classes co-curricular and extracurricular activities, students from all levels are encouraged to participate in developing and expressing themselves creatively in Drama, Dance and the Visual Arts.

Our dedicated faculty members inspire students to push boundaries and think outside the box, whether they’re studying Visual Arts, Drama or Dance. Within our programmes, students develop collaborative skills and the confidence to create new and innovative performances and visual work. We also offer an extensive extracurricular programme that includes:

Drama

Students can partake in Theatresports, Canterbury and National Shakespeare Festivals and of course Drama Club, which performs a show each year for the community to enjoy.

Dance

In the Dance Academy programme both juniors and seniors work tirelessly for regional and national competitions, with titles annually.

Arts

Our Visual Arts students compete in competitions and take part in exhibitions that allow them to sell their work to the general public. We also offer a huge variety of clubs and arts-related groups for students to engage in.

Follow your rhythm

Burnside High School has a well-deserved reputation for excellence in Music. The co-curricular music programme is large and diverse, with an emphasis on achieving the very highest possible musical standards. The opportunities for you to pursue your musical passions are endless.

Music Programmes

A wide range of music courses are available at every level, including a unique Performance Music option for year nine, and the option to study Cambridge Music at GCSE, AS and Advanced level in senior years. As well as the full-time music staff, we also benefit from a large team of visiting itinerant teachers who provide specialist tuition in a variety of instruments.

Our young musicians are provided with outstanding experiences and students regularly achieve outstanding success in competitions and festivals such as The Big Sing, NZ Essential Jazz Band Competition, Jazz Quest, Aurora Festival, Rockquest and The NZCT Schools' Chamber Music Contest.

Each year many Burnside High School musicians successfully audition for nationally selected groups such as the NZSO National Youth Orchestra, New Zealand Youth Jazz Orchestra, New Zealand Secondary Schools' Choir, New Zealand Youth Choir and New Zealand Secondary Schools' Symphony Orchestra.

Specialist Music Programme (SMP)

The SMP is designed to cater for students with considerable experience and talent as musicians. The students are selected to partake in the programme by audition.

The programme is unique within New Zealand and offers the highest possible standard of musical education and opportunities. As an SMP student you maintain a focus on music throughout your time at high school, however you follow the same timetable and have the same subject options available as other students.

Major scholarships have been awarded to our SMP students entering tertiary music education in recent years by institutions such as the YST Conservatory (Singapore), Sydney Conservatory, Royal College of Music (London), North Texas University (USA) and the New Zealand School of Music (Wellington).







We offer abundant opportunities for both personal growth and academic achievement, and provide academic and pastoral support to all of our International students with a focus on pathways to tertiary study.

Build skills for the future

Burnside High School's emphasis on future focussed skills, particularly in digital technologies and information technology (IT), reflects our forward-thinking approach to education.

Our curriculum is designed to equip students with the necessary skills and knowledge to participate and succeed in a rapidly evolving digital landscape. We offer an extensive range of subjects in digital technologies and computer science, covering basic computer literacy through to more specialised areas such as coding, software development, digital design and electronics.

We place emphasis on the importance of digital literacy for each individual student, so you can reach your full potential and excel in the modern world.

IT Facilities

Our dedicated computer labs with up-to-date hardware and software allow students to practice skills, work on projects and explore the latest in digital technologies.

We cater to a range of subjects that utilise modern technology – Art and Design, DVC, Music and Maths classes all have specialist computers, computer rooms and software.

For advanced Digital and Electronics subjects, we have invested in specialised equipment and software, such as 3D printers, robotics kits, and design programmes. This enables students to explore innovative technologies and creative projects with advanced, fit for purpose technology.

BYOD

Burnside High School adopts a blended e-learning approach to teaching and learning. We seamlessly integrate technology into the classroom allowing for a more personalised learning experience. Our blended approach ensures that students are always ready to engage with digital learning resources, both in and out of the classroom.



Explore our campus

Burnside High School is situated on an attractively landscaped 16 hectare site, providing high quality indoor and outdoor learning spaces and a place for everyone to belong.

Our facilities effectively meet the diverse and changing learning needs of our students. We have specialist rooms fit for purpose including well equipped areas for Music, Art, Drama, Dance and Languages. Science and Technology will be operating out of our newest state of the art and purpose built block, Pukehinau.

The gymnasium complex comprises two gyms, a weights room, physical education classrooms and spacious changing facilities. High quality playing fields, a hard court turf and a newly constructed 25 metre outdoor heated pool also give our sports people a place to excel outdoors.

We have a designated Whare, and a meeting place for Pasifika students, that ensures students can express and practise their cultures and feel a sense of belonging.

Aurora Centre

The Aurora Centre is a 229sqm state of the art, multi-purpose venue designed for the presentation of a wide range of activities. The venue complex is air-conditioned and contains a large auditorium, meeting and functions room, dressing rooms and foyer areas. The auditorium accommodates 700 people in ergonomically designed, tiered seating.
